KEY TAKEAWAYS

Institutions must operate within a specific legal framework when responding to campus sexual misconduct while also creating a safe, respectful campus that recognizes each case has unique needs. Improved response to sexual misconduct on campus requires coordinated comprehensive processes that

- Encourage reporting while providing access to a variety of resources for all students,
- Offer equitable resolution practices and interim or post-resolution measures, and
- Focus on collaboration and communication both on campus and within the community.
