6. Related Case Information <p>Per case agent, on April 3, 2019, the decedent was found in a barrel in a shallow river running perpendicular to Rose Water Lane in Lillington County. The decedent was observed wearing jeans and a red T-shirt and wrapped in a white blanket. No identification was found on his person. Cinderblocks were found in the barrel. The decedent had two suspected bullet wounds to his right hip and right shoulder. However, no cartridge cases were found at the scene. At this time, the decedent's identity has yet to be determined and the weapon used has not been recovered.</p>
