Item 2 - One (1) projectile collected from right hip of John Doe at autopsy

Item 2 was examined, weighed, and measured to determine caliber. The caliber class of Item 2 was determined to be 9mm.

The item was physically and microscopically examined. Marks of value were found, and it was concluded that the item may be suitable for identification with other firearms related evidence.

Item 3 - One (1) projectile collected from right shoulder of John Doe at autopsy

Item 3 was examined, weighed, and measured to determine caliber. The caliber class of Item 2 was determined to be 9mm.

The item was physically and microscopically examined. Marks of value were found, and it was concluded that the item may be suitable for identification with other firearms related evidence.

Item 2 and Item 3 were examined and microscopically compared to each other and were identified as being fired from the same unknown firearm.

Item 2 and Item 3 are consistent with bullets loaded in 9mm Luger and .357 SIG caliber cartridges based upon weight and style. Firearms manufactured with general rifling characteristics similar to these items include, but are not limited to:
